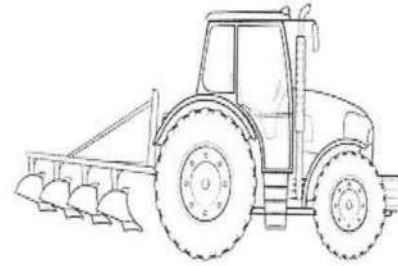

Plain is a flat and low lying land surface. They are also called lowlands. They can be level or slightly hilly. The slope of the land is gentle. Plain may be formed by deposition of sand and silt by rivers, as in the case of the Northern plain of India. Rivers carry sand and silt with them. When the rivers slow down, these materials are deposited on their banks. Plains are formed by these deposits. Some plains are in the interior of the continent while some are near the sea coast. Plains are more thickly populated than mountains and plateaus.
